1. Revelation: Short Essay

Length: 1500 words

Learning outcomes: 3, 4 Weighting: 25%

Due date: Sunday, 16 August by 11.59pm.

Discuss the perspectives of two different theologians as to what constitutes the authority and

inspiration of the Bible. Critically evaluate the positions demonstrating appreciation of the implications for the church, mission and discipleship.

### Criteria for Assessment

- Does the essay address the topic clearly and comprehensively?
- Quality of discussion and depth of critical understanding apparent in the essay.
- Evidence and quality of research for essay. Access and use of appropriate books, journal articles, and other sources.
- Quality of written expression. Accuracy in referencing and bibliography according to Laidlaw College approved style.

## 2. Christology: Theological Reflection on Art

Length: 1500 words

Learning outcomes: 1, 2 Weighting: 25%

Due date: Sunday, 27<sup>th</sup> September by 11.59pm.

Reflect *theologically* on a work of visual art depicting Jesus Christ. Discuss the work, its reception and what Christologically informed reflection it elicits.

#### Criteria for Assessment

- Suitability of the work selected for reflection
- Reflection demonstrates appreciation of possible Christological doctrines and issues inherent in the chosen work.
- Quality of discussion and depth of understanding apparent in the reflection.
- Evidence and quality of research for essay. Access and use of appropriate books, journal articles, and other sources.
- Quality of written expression. Accuracy in referencing and bibliography according to Laidlaw College approved style.

# 3. Research Essay

Length: 2500 words
Learning outcomes: 1, 2, 4
Weighting: 50%

Due date: Sunday, 22<sup>nd</sup> November by 11.59pm

What is the significance of the death of Jesus Christ?

Your essay should take into account developments in Christology and atonement, including early church positions and contemporary reframing of doctrine, as well contemporary Christological challenges and perspectives.
