ASSESSMENT TASKS AND DUE DATES

1. Online Discussion and Reflection

Learning outcomes: 1-7
Due date: Weeks 2-8 (Schedule will be given to students)
Weighting: 35% (5% each)
Length: Initial post of 250 words; follow-up post of 100 words

The online discussion requires you to engage with a variety of readings. This requires students to respond to each reading with an initial post of 250 words, followed by a response to another post of about 100 words.

In your response to the assigned reading, you should: (a) briefly summarise the author's key point/s (b) identify the key theological/missiological issues, and (c) the implications of the reading for missional theology, life and/or practice.

2. Research Essay

Learning outcomes: 1-7
Due date: End of week 9 (17th May 2015)
Length: 2500 words
Weighting: 40%

Choose a critical issue in mission today that needs to be addressed from a biblical perspective, a theological perspective or in the light of twentieth/twenty-first century debates.

You may choose an issue from the following list or another if you check with the lecturer first.

In the essay you will be expected to do the following:

- Explain why this issue is important to you and why you have chosen it
- Explain a context and background in which your chosen issue became significant
- Identify and describe the important matters raised and the areas of debate generated by this topic
- Show how key biblical/theological insights bear on the issue
- Explain why this issue is important for mission today
- Summarize how your thinking has been changed or expanded by studying this topic

3. Summative Statement

Learning outcomes: 1, 2, 3, 6, 7
Date: End of Week 12 (7th Jun 2015)
Length: 1000 – 1200
Weighting: 25%

Write your own summary theology of mission statement outlining your definition/understanding of mission and the role of God's people in mission. This summary should include references to both biblical material and mission conferences documents, as well as refer to the course readings and materials.

GRADING CRITERIA

Online Discussion and Reflection

- Evidence of understanding of reading
- Identification of key issues
- Application to theology, life or practice
- Constructive participation: good engagement with other posts; use of open ended questions or clear consideration of others' questions

- Timeliness of contributions to forum: deadlines met; posts are made in time for others to engage with
- Clarity and structure of contributions: logical and descriptive titles and structure; accurate spelling and grammar

Research Essay

- Explains why the issue is important (for the student) and why it was chosen
- Explains the context and background to the chosen issue
- Identifies and describes the important matters raised and areas of debate generated by the topic
- Shows how key biblical/theological insights bear on the issue
- Explains why this issue is important for mission today
- Summarizes how personal thinking has been changed or expanded by study of this topic
- Uses a wide range of resources effectively
- Presents clear structure, logical arrangement of ideas and valid conclusions
- Exhibits appropriate communication and presentation: clarity, format, spelling, grammar, annotation and bibliography
