COURSE DESCRIPTION

The nature of Old Testament prophecy and the language of prophecy. The eighth century prophets with special reference to the book of Amos. Either a) exegesis of selections of the English text of Amos, or b) translation and exegesis of selections of the Hebrew text of Amos.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of the course students should be able to:

1. Critically assess a broad spectrum of views on the nature of Old Testament prophecy.
2. Demonstrate an advanced understanding of significant issues relating to the structure, formation, authorship and context of Amos.
3. Analyse the main literary and theological themes in eighth century prophecy, with particular reference to Amos.
4. Analyse differing approaches to Old Testament ethics with particular respect to eighth century prophets.
5. Demonstrate skill in exegesis and interpretation of specified prophetic texts, and their relevance to a broad range of issues within the Christian church today.
6. [Hebrew option: demonstrate ability in reading and interpreting the Hebrew text of the eighth century prophets, and demonstrate skill in applying a range of linguistic insights to the task of exegesis.]
