COURSE DESCRIPTION

Detailed study of the text of Luke's Gospel; theology and critical issues of Luke's Gospel. Exegesis of selected English texts, or translation and exegesis of selected texts in Greek.

- Co-requisite: 111 Biblical Interpretation

LEARNING OUTCOMES

For the English exegesis option:

By the end of this course, students will:

1. Have a good knowledge of the content of Luke's Gospel.
2. Have a thorough understanding of the life setting, purpose, and main emphases of Luke's Gospel with reference to contemporary Lukan scholarship.
3. Be able to utilise the insights of the full range of critical and exegetical methodologies in presenting an exegetical analysis of a selected passage from Luke's Gospel.
4. Independently and critically research a major Lukan theme with special reference to Luke's Gospel and contemporary Lukan scholarship.

For the Greek exegesis option:

By the end of this course, students will:

1. Have read through selected portions of the Greek text of Luke and critically reflected on these readings.
2. Have a thorough understanding of the life setting, purpose, and main emphases of Luke's Gospel with reference to Lukan scholarship.
3. Be able to utilise the insights of the full range of major critical and exegetical methodologies, including textual criticism, in presenting an exegetical analysis of a selected passage from Luke's Gospel in its original language.
4. Independently and critically research a major Lukan theme with special reference to Luke's Gospel and contemporary Lukan scholarship.
