COURSE DESCRIPTION

John Calvin wrote that a true knowledge of God and a true knowledge of oneself depend on one another. This course aims to help students deepen both kinds of knowledge, through engagement with Scripture and a variety of Christian spiritual traditions, reflection on their own and others' spiritual journeys, and the development of spiritual practices for life and vocation.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

By the end of this course, each student will have demonstrated their ability to:

1. Identify the people, ideas, life events and personal responses which have shaped their spiritual journey to date.
2. Reflect theologically and scripturally on different approaches relating to spiritual practices, and how these may be personally applied.
3. Describe distinctive features of Christian spirituality, with particular regard to Christ, community and creation.
4. Reflect upon others' viewpoints and experiences in ways that show respect and self-awareness.
5. Write in clear, concise English: grammatically correct sentences; well-organised and cohesive paragraphs; accurate spelling.
6. Demonstrate appropriate referencing of Scripture, and of other sources with footnotes and bibliography.
