COURSE DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this course is to inform students of the Anglican tradition of preaching from scripture, and the role of preaching in Anglican mission over time and place. The course is further targeted to help prepare students to preach biblical sermons that witness to the good news of God in Jesus Christ and that connect with audiences across a breadth of culture and context.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of the course students should be able to:

- a. Understand the role of preaching in the Anglican Reformation
- b. Discuss the place of preaching within Anglican liturgy
- c. Connect preaching to missional and pastoral ecclesiological priorities
- d. Identify the characteristics of a biblical sermon
- e. Develop a methodology which integrates the biblical context and the contemporary context in the preaching event and shape sermons that reflect exegesis of the text, the world, the listeners, and themselves as preachers.
- f. Develop techniques which enable truth to be conveyed through personality in the preaching event.
- g. Articulate personal convictions about the place of biblical preaching today.
