COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course identifies the theological and global realities of suffering, injustice and need. It affirms the holistic nature of God's mission to the world and the call to express mercy and justice, seeking to bring social transformation through community, national and international aid and development. This course seeks to develop creative approaches to holistic social transformation through engagement with theology, history and contemporary interventions.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of this course, students should be able to:

- a. Articulate and defend a biblical basis for holism and describe how social transformation relates today to God's mandate, the *missio Dei*, *shalom*, the kingdom of God, Christ's manifesto.
- b. Review, analyze and critique Christian approaches to Social Transformation.
- c. Articulate and advocate a theological understanding of Social Transformation/ Development.
- d. Critically appraise the theoretical undergirding and present models of praxis in selected specific issues within social transformation praxis (e.g., Justice, Micro-Finance, Spirituality, AIDS, Women, Children, Political Engagement, Appropriate Technology, Sustainability, Global Warming)
- e. Discuss critically the potential role and future challenges for the Church/Christian community ministries or NGOs in the praxis of Social Transformation.
- f. Demonstrate skill in appraising and accessing a range of resources (books, articles, journals, videos, web-sites) where one could find more information on specific 'development' issues.
