

**607.615 Christianity and Other Religions**

**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course explores the central belief systems of the world religions, local religions and spiritualities, and secularism. Students explore a range of interreligious relationships and develop of theology of religion. Key cultural, political, historical, and religious factors are examined and how these factors affect Christian witness in present day contexts both in Aotearoa and beyond.
